Home reading expectations

The children will be given a book each week and are expected to read every day and have their reading records signed. Regular reading helps children to succeed in all areas of the curriculum. Without being able to read children will find all learning a little harder. **We can help them by encouraging them and helping them to read.**

Other homework expectations

Homework will come in a variety of ways:

TT Rockstars (children should complete a minimum of 5 garage and 5 studio sessions); spellings—10 spellings will be sent home on Friday to learn for a test the following Friday; and an English and Maths activity each week.

To support my learning in Maths, I should be able to....

- count forwards and backwards from 0- 100
- Read and write numbers from 0- 100
- Compare numbers from 0-100 using < > or =
- Recall number bonds to 10 and 20
- Add and subtract two 2-digit numbers mentally (without renaming)
- To use column addition/subtraction when adding two 2-digit numbers with renaming
- Add three single digit numbers
- Recall my 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Understand and use the symbols for multiplying and dividing
- Divide numbers by 2, 5, and 10 (understanding that a number can be shared or grouped)

To support my learning in Writing, I should be able to....

- form lower case letters making sure they are consistently the same size
- Start using diagonal and horizontal strokes to join letters
- Write capital letters and digits ensuring that they are the correct size in relation to one another and lower case letters
- Use finger spaces that reflect the size of the letters being used.
- Use capital letters and full stops accurately
- Learn to spell common exception words (year 1/2)
- Learn to spell contracted words (don't, won't etc)
- Learn how to use the possessive apostrophe (the girl's book)
- Use sentences of different forms: statements, question, exclamation and commas.
- Write expanded noun phrases (the blue butterfly)
- Use conjunctions (when, if, because, and, or, but)
- Write in the present and past tense correctly and consistently
- Write a story about a personal experience or experience of others (real and fiction)
- Write about real events

To support my learning in Reading, I should be able to....

- read frequently used words without decoding to support fluency
- Sound out unfamiliar words and blend without hesitation
- Reread books to build fluency and confidence in word reading
- Read non-fiction books that are structured in different ways
- Discuss the meanings of words
- Discuss books and express views
- Recognise recurring language in stories
- Check the text makes sense to them as they read and correct inaccurate reading
- Make predictions on what might happen based on what has been read so far
- Answer retrieval questions (going back to the book to find the answer)
- Answer inference questions (using clues from what has happened to answer a questions e.g. Harry's face went bright red. How do you think Harry was feeling? I think Harry was embarrassed because his face went bright red.
