Home reading expectations

Please listen to your child read at least 3 times a week. Your child will be given a reading book linked to our Little Wandle phonics scheme—they need to have this in school every day for their group reading sessions.

Regular reading helps children to succeed in all areas of the curriculum. Without being able to read children will find all learning a little harder. We can help them by encouraging them and helping them to read.

Other homework expectations

Homework information will be sent out at the start of the half-term. We will send weekly spelling practice sheets and children will be tested each week.

Other class information

To support my learning in school I should be able to...

Basic skills

- Take turns in conversation, put your hand up before you talk and respond to what has been said.
- Sit on the carpet with their legs crossed, listen, remember what has been said and follow instructions.
- Sit at the table without getting up.
- Putting your hand up if you need help (not walking around the classroom after an adult).

Social skills

- To take turns during carpet time and in discussions.
- Share the resources at my table by taking turns.
- Show some independence by using the resources at my table before I ask an adult.
- Discuss my ideas with my table partner and help them if they ask.

To support my learning in Maths, I should be able to....

- Count to 20 in the correct order.
- To recognise numbers to 10
- To use 5 frames to make numbers up to 5.
- To use 10 frames to make numbers up to 10.
- To subitize numbers up to 5. (Knowing what the amount is without having to count it)
- To understand that when we add we put more objects into the whole.
- To understand that when we subtract we take away objects from the whole.

To support my learning in English, I should be able to....

Reading

- To know the pure sound of all the single setters and some digraphs such as th, ch, sh, ng, nk and qu.
- To orally blend words eg: **c-a-t** -> cat **ch-i-ck-e-n** -> chicken
- To read (sound out and blend) CVC words that have known graphemes. E.g: hat -> h-a-t -> *child says
- To discuss events or answer questions from a story that has been read to them by an adult.

Writing

- To sit at a table correctly.
- To hold a pencil securely with the correct tripod pencil grip.
- To orally segment words eg: **c-a-t** -> cat **ch-i-ck-e-n** -> chicker.
- To say a 3, 4 or 5 word sentence, pinch it on their hand and make a phonetically plausible attempt of writing it down.
- To orally tell a story using some story language. Eg. Once upon a time, A long time ago.
- To write 3 simple sentences to tell a story or describe a picture.
